activated by TM64YL team during TM64YL expedition at Noirmoutier Island between August 25-31st, 2018. Ranking of the stations having made greatest number of QSO with TM64YL will be published by TM64YL team after the expedition.

- * Date & Period: The TM64YL challenge is organized during presence of TM64YL team on the Noirmoutier Island. It will start at on Saturday 25th August 2018 18h00 UTC until Friday 31st August 12h00 UTC.
- * Ranking: Each daily QSO (mode and band) completed with TM64YL (dupe excluded) credit one point to the station contacted (callsign).
- * Results: A list of Top 10 stations with largest number of valid contacts will be published on the TM64YL site.

This Lighthouse is a replica of the original which fell into the sea during a storm in 1927. It currently features a museum and is the focal point of the Tuckerton Seaport. The purpose of this experimental Web site is to provide 24-7-365 actual (REALTIME) band condition information to CW QRPp, QRPe and CW/SSB for Contesters interested in increasing their scores. It can also be of benefit to other Radio Amateurs to determine band conditions for Nets and casual QSO's. This information is NOT based on any software predictions or any kind of satellite based readings. It is based on a new Ionospheric sounding method called "HF Ionospheric Interferometry" which operates very similarly to the PolSAR system used by NASA.
